Facilities Update:

Chris explained that a schedule has been made and maintenance is still sanitizing everywhere. Interior projects are still on hold. The exterior door project at Merry Ave is back out to bid. The lowest bidder was Full Scope Contracting with \$24,000. On a motion made by James Hunt and seconded by Paul McCormack, the Board voted 3-0 to approve Full Scope Contracting for the project. Chestnut Street porches and exterior side doors will be replaced. The requests for quotes went out today.

Old Business/New Business:

Dede reported that just about everything has been reimbursed due to COVID.
